I hope you all can continue supporting your local forum, so that the Lived Experience of families continues to improve for both now and for future generations.




Donna writes ...I am loving the face to face workshops, bridging the gap for families. The fun day and activities we have put on to suit all families, ages and disabilities.








### WHAT IS A PARENT CARER FORUM?

A parent carer forum is a group of parents and carers of children with a special educational need and/or disability (diagnosed or not) who work with local authorities, education settings, health providers and other providers to make sure the services they commission, plan and deliver meet the needs of SEND children and families in the local area.

The National Network of Parent Carer Forums (NNPCF) is made up of all of the parent carer forums from across England. The NNPCF ensures that local parent carer forums are aware of national developments. It promotes opportunities for the voice of parent carers to influence at a national level.

The NNPCF works closely with the Department for Education, the Department of Health, and other partner organisations to improve outcomes for children and young people with disabilities or additional needs and their families.


#### Vision

These values and the way we behave to demonstrate them are what makes us so special; they are:





Last year (2022) HAF were not SEND friendly	<ul> <li>Feedback to SCC who manage the HAF programme. (Training has been rolled out to all SEN accredited programmes (purple starts on website).</li> <li>Ryan has attended 2 coffee mornings in recent months to hear the feedback and share the developments for this summer.</li> <li>SEND accredited providers can apply for funding for 1:1s for young people.</li> <li>Feedback this summer (2023) is far more positive.</li> </ul>

# SEND FUN DAY 2023

On the 6th April 2023 we held a SEND fun day with local service providers. This was a free event for families to attend.

We had a range of entertainment for the children and young people with 385 adults and 437 children attending who signed in.

In the main space there was a range of different local serive providers for families to speak to for support, advice or ideas.


